Firehorse and Shadow is a performance work situated in Vancouver's Historic Chinatown. It exists as a set of stories combining elements of contemporary dance, shadow puppetry, animation, film, and theatre. The stories belong to choreographer Andrea Nann whose great-grandmother Mew Lee was 'sold' by her family in China and sent to Vancouver as a servant girl in early 1900. Mew gave birth to Nann's grandmother Lin in Vancouver's Shanghai Alley in 1912. Although Lin never left Vancouver she was forced to identify as a Chinese citizen when she married a Chinese man. Nann's mother Bev was born during Canada's Chinese Exclusion Act. She was taught to value assimilation during times of extreme anti-Chinese attitudes.

Firehorse and Shadow brings forward embodied, felt and often untold stories focusing on but not limited to the lived experiences of Chinese Canadian women. In this work intangible experiences are given form through Nann's embodied familial histories process that has been developed in collaboration with core collaborators: director/dance-storyteller Sarah Chase; dramaturge/visual artist Cindy Mochizuki; and shadow artist/performer Annie Katsura Rollins. The work explores memory, sensation, perception, personal histories, relationships, cosmology, Chinese medicine, food, and fate.

ARTIST BIOS



Andrea Nann

Fire Horse Andrea dances to reach across distance and to experience herself and others in celebration of possibility, plurality, imagination, originality, and belonging. She is a contemporary dance artist, deep listener, founding artist of Dreamwalker Dance Company, and founder/co-creator of Conscious Bodies, an embodied community practice. Andrea is a graduate of York University's Department of Fine Arts and has contributed to the creation of new works by over 70 dance and theatre creators from across Turtle Island. She has been

recognized for outstanding choreography, performance, contributions to the performing arts sector and for her work in community actioning. For Andrea, dance and embodiment shifts attitudes and ways of being, tuning us into what makes each of us distinct, to what we share, and ultimately how we can live together in wonderment and peace.



Annie Katsura Rollins

Metal Monkey Annie is a Chinese/Japanese/English/Irish theatre maker, arts researcher and community artist. She incorporates ethnographic research and apprenticeship into her work, with particular interest in traditional puppet forms in Asia and their intersection with ritual practice and community building. She was awarded a Fulbright Fellowship to canvas Mainland China for the last remaining shadow puppet artists in 2011 and named valedictorian in 2019 for her PhD on the possibilites of preserving intangible performative culture at

Concordia University. Annie lives in Toronto and co-curates at Concrete Cabaret, an experimental performing object collective, and is a community arts manager at MABELLE Arts. She is a metal monkey who partnered with a fire snake, and together they are raising a fire monkey and a metal ox - her family is her favorite menagerie. anniekatsurarollins.com.



Sarah Chase

Fire Horse Sarah has performed her dancestory work across Canada and Europe. She also toured with both Benôit Lachambre's Dance par B. Lieux, and with German choreographer Raimund Hoghe. Her many works created for Canadian artists include Toronto Dance Theatre, Peggy Baker, Andrea Nann, Theatre Replacement, AntonijaLivingstone, Montreal Danse, and Marc Boivin. She is the recipient of the Jacqueline Lemieux Award for Excellence from the Canada Council for the Arts, and received the Prize of the Festival at

the Munich Dance Biennale. The solos she created for both Peggy Baker, and Andrea Nann won Doras. She is an associate dance artist of the Canadian National Arts Centre. Sarah loves waking up to the chorus of frogs under the stars, the dawn chorus of birds in the spring, and the several generations of deer she has come to know while living on Hornby Island.



Cindy Mochizuki

Fire Dragon Cindy Mochizuki creates multi-media installation, audio fiction, performance, animation, drawings, public artworks and community-engaged projects. She has exhibited, performed and screened her work in Canada, US, Australia, and Japan. Recent exhibitions include the Art Gallery at Evergreen, Kamloops Art Gallery, Prince Takamado Gallery at the Canadian Embassy in Tokyo, Japan, Nanaimo Art Gallery, Agnes Etherington Art Centre, Vancouver Art Gallery, Frye Art Museum, and Yonago City Museum. She received the

Vancouver Mayor's Arts Award in New Media and Film (2015) and the Jack and Doris Shadbolt Foundation for the Visual Arts VIVA Award (2020). She has worked for theatre and dance companies in scenography, animation design and dramaturgy including Theatre Replacement, Rumble Theatre, Little Onion Puppet Company, Lisa Mariko Gelley, Theatre Calgary and Arts Club Theatre. 

includes coordinating Moonhorse Dance Theatre's Dance Encounter Series, Inclusion Advising with Wild Soma, Outside eye processes for Carol Anderson and Movement coaching for Xi Wang. Silagy works extensively with Andrea Nann and Dreamwalker sharing practices, which through artistic exchange, bring together Communities, Indigenous Teachings, and Artists. Silagy is developing The Reverie Duets, celebrating difference.



Kelsi James

Earth Tiger Kelsi James (they/she) is a white queer and asexual theatre creator, producer and performer, who works most often from the unceded territories of the Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh, and from Tkarón:to. Kelsi has a degree in Musical Theatre from Sheridan and a certificate in ASL & Deaf Studies from VCC. Kelsi has composed for Driftwood Theatre (King Henry V) and Theatre Rusticle (The Tempest), and has been a Creative Producer for Dreamwalker since 2021. She is the founding creative producer of Art For Ace Week, and has

developed queer centred work through programs at the Paprika Festival, Arts Club, Rumble, Tarragon, Sound Off, and the frank. The questions that compel Kelsi as a creator are: how do I blend theatre with community gathering? How do I build accessibility into the bones of my work? How do I honour the queer ancestors, and how can I empower the next gen queers?



Laura Runions

Earth Snake Lauren Runions is a dance artist, choreographer and facilitator based in Tkarón:to and Kjipuktuk. For Lauren dancing involves moving-thinking, writing, choreographic objects, community labs, performances and daily independent practice. Their work investigates the role of social choreography as a reciprocal spatial practice.
